NOTICE OF RACE

The notation (NP) in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a)

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing [RRS].
- 1.2 All documents, including any amendments, pertaining to this event are available at *The Official Notice Board*
- 1.3 The prescriptions of the RYA
- 1.4 Racing rules will be changed as follows:
Any changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions. The sailing instructions may also change other racing rules

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available at registration and may be available on the Associations' web site and *The Official Notice Board* beforehand.

3 COMMUNICATIONS

- 3.1 (DP)Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 3.2 The official notice board online at (*URL to be confirmed*), also Notices to competitors will be posted on a board located in the Tenby SC clubhouse.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The regatta is open
 - to boats of the GP14 Class whose helm and crew are members of the International GP 14 Association.
 - to boats of the International Enterprise Class whose helm is a member of the Enterprise Class Association
 - to boats of the Miracle Class whose helm is a member of the Miracle Class Association
- 4.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the relevant Class entry form available on the Class web sites, including the required fee.
- 4.3 The closing date for entries is midnight on Friday July 26th, 2025.
- 4.4 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.5 Competitors who are under 18 before and including the last date of the regatta must have a declaration form completed by their parent or guardian before they will be allowed to compete. This applies to helms and crews. The parental declaration form is part of the entry form.
- 4.6 For the GP14 Class, Competitors shall declare their fleet grading when entering. The guidelines for fleet selection are noted on the GP14 entry form.

5 FEES

- 5.1 The entry fees for the Enterprise, GP14 and Miracle classes are included in the Class specific entry forms on the individual Class web sites. (See NoR 20 for the class web site addresses). These fees may be different for each class because of the inclusion of prizes, certain social events etc. within the entry fee.
- 5.2 The fee covers entrance to some social events which may differ for different classes, details at the end of this Notice of Race.
- 5.3 Cancellation of entry will incur a cancellation cost which is detailed on the entry form

6. CREW LIMITATIONS

- 6.1 For the GP14 Class - Substitution of the person named as helm will be allowed before the start of the Championship, after that time the change of helm will be considered as a new entry. Substitution of the person named as crew during the event will be permitted only with the written permission of the Race Committee.

7. ADVERTISING

- 7.1 (DP) Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.

8 SCHEDULE

- 8.1 Registration: Tenby Sailing Club –
Saturday Aug 2nd, 13.00-18.00, Sunday Aug 3rd 09.00 to 11.00
- 8.2 Competitor Briefing: 11.00 hrs on Sunday August 3rd., Tenby Sailing Club
- 8.3 Nine races are scheduled.
- 8.4 The classes will have separate starts and will be started in ascending order of PY number, that is, First start Enterprise, Second start GP14, Third start Miracle Class. The warning signal times given below are for the first warning for each sequence of three starts.

8.5 Schedule

~~8.6~~—The practice race may be abandoned after starting and if so, will not be resailed. The start for Points-race one will follow:

~~8.7~~—Wednesday 6th August is an optional race day. The Race Committee may programme racing as necessary to complete the schedule.

8.8 On the last scheduled day of racing the first warning signal of a race will not be made after 14:30hrs.

9 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 9.1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules, the notice of race or sailing instructions. When requested by a race official, a boat shall be made available for inspection. [DP]
- 9.2 The fact that race officials may conduct inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out in the rules, including this Notice of Race.

For the GP14 Class

- 9.3 Each boat shall produce a valid measurement certificate at registration. Only certified sails may be used.
- 9.4 At registration all boats shall present a completed self-declaration measurement form. The form to be completed will be made available to all boats entered after the entry closing date.

For the Miracle Class

- 9.5 For the Miracle Class, one set of sails may be used for the event which may be replaced if damaged.

For the Enterprise Class

10 VENUE

10.1 The venue is Tenby Sailing Club, The Harbour, Tenby, Pembrokeshire, SA707BW. The racing area will be in Carmarthen Bay. Admiralty Chart 5620_16 refers.

11 COURSES

11.1 The courses will be defined in the Sailing Instructions. Each class will sail similar courses with common starting and finishing lines.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 11.1 RRS Appendix T, Arbitration, will apply. If a party is not present at an arbitration meeting, any party that was present may take a Post-Race Penalty as defined in RRS T1(b) at any time until the Protest Committee has completed taking evidence. This changes RRS T1(a).

13 SCORING

13.1 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

13.2a) When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

13.2.1 When 4 to 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

13.2.2 When more than 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

14 SUPPORT BOATS

14.1 Support boats will not be permitted.

15 BERTHING

(DP) Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while in the boat park.

16 DATA PROTECTION

Competitors (both helm and crew) will be requested to complete a data protection form at registration. Details are given in the Additional Information section after the end of this Notice.

17. RISK STATEMENT

Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or

to continue racing is hers alone.”

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

18. INSURANCE

- a. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per event or the equivalent. Competitors shall sign a declaration to that effect at registration. Insurance is the sole responsibility of the competitors.

19 PRIZES

- a. Trophies will be awarded to winners of the Championship. Different prizes for the Classes are listed in the Appendix to this Notice.
- b. Additional prizes may be awarded by the organisers.

Additional Information

1. Accommodation – for accommodation in the Tenby area please contact Tenby Customer and Information centre, 01437 775603. Tenby.tic@pembrokeshire.gov.uk

2. Camping – There is a chance that camping may be available at the school. The nearest camp site is Camping Kiln Park is the other main camping ground in Tenby, but they do separate Tents from Camper vans. Both Greenhill School and Kiln Park are 15min walking distance from the harbour.

3. A social programme is being organised and will be advised at a later date.

4. GDPR – Personal Data permission.

Legislation from May 2018 onwards changes the way in which personal data can be collected, used and destroyed. The Organising Authority (OA) for this Championship will follow the guidelines of the national authority in order to comply with GDPR.

The Personal Data Permission Form, made available to each competitor at registration, covers items such as, but not limited to,

- taking of photographs and videos for use by the Club or the Class
- retention of contact data to inform about future events
- publication of names, clubs and boat numbers on Class web site before the regatta
- publication of race results during and after the regatta.

The OA has adopted a data protection policy which will be on display at the registration desk.

5. Car parking, the one next to the club building will be rented to the club and all public access (permit holders) will be restricted. We will most likely need to use this area for boat storage during the week.
