MINUTES OF THE 57th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE G.P. FOURTEEN CLASS INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION

HELD AT MOUNTS BAY SAILING CLUB ON MONDAY 13TH AUGUST 2007

PRESENT: H. Gill, President; I. Sinclair, Vice-President; N. Henry, President of Irish Assoc; D. Rowlands, P. Simes and J.G. Knox, Past Presidents; M. Cooper, Treasurer; H. Davies, Hon Secretary; O. Geraghty, Secretary of Irish Assoc, and 54 members.

MEETING OPENED: The President, Hugh Gill, opened the meeting by welcoming the members and introducing the Officers. He congratulated lan Dobson and Andy Tunnicliffe on becoming the 2007 GP14 World Champions in Sligo.

APOLOGIES: Apologies for absence were received from L. Baalham and P. F. Rowan.

MINUTES: The Minutes of the 56th Annual General Meeting were taken as read and approved. Proposed by Ian Dobson, seconded by Mandy Mitchell.

HON SECRETARY'S REPORT: The Hon Secretary's report was presented to the meeting and adopted (copy appended)

HON TREASURER'S REPORT: The Hon Treasurer's report and Annual Accounts were presented to the meeting and adopted (copy appended). Proposed by Graham Knox and seconded by Chris Beddow.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS: In accordance with the Constitution, the meeting approved the following nominated Officers:

ELECTION OF COMMITTEE MEMBERS: In accordance with Clause 5(b) of the constitution, four nominations had been received and they were duly elected. They were Liz Hall, Paul Leavers, Steve Parker and Luke Shaw. In addition, Oliver Shaw was nominated to represent non-racing interests and duly elected.

ELECTION OF ACCOUNTANT: The election of Mr Aidan Sergents of Liverpool, to continue as the Association Accountant was proposed by Maurice Cooper, seconded by John Salomonson and accepted by the members for the next financial year.

SUBSCRIPTION RATES: In accordance with the Constitution, revised Subscription rates are proposed for the 2008 subscription year, as follows:

- i. Full member subscription £27
- ii Associate member subscription £21
- iii Youth member subscription £13 (remains the same)

A £2 discount will be applied to subscriptions paid by direct debit

Proposed by Maurice Cooper and seconded by Ian Sinclair, the members agreed to the revised subscription rates.

NOTICE OF MOTION: To alter the Constitution as proposed by the Technical & Rules Sub-Committee on 3rd February 2007:

re UK Area Championships and the Constitution

Article 4 "These areas shall be designated Championship Areas and shall be appropriately named: ... to be deleted and replaced with These areas shall be named: ..."

Following the list of areas add the sentence:

"A programme of Championships shall be organised each year on a regional basis, the number and format of such events to be decided by the Committee".

The Chairman of the T&R Committee, David Rowlands, explained the reason for wanting to change the Constitution. After a short debate, the members voted in favour of the proposition and the Notice of Motion was carried.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS: The agenda items being concluded, the President H Gill then invited questions from the floor.

There followed a lively debate on Championship format and socials, about which a variety of opinions were expressed. In summary, the following points were brought to the Committee's attention:

- · Greater emphasis on providing a social programme at major Championship events
- Most preferred mass starts at the Worlds 2008 rather than a fleet system
- · Many wanted more line starts at major Championships when the entry numbers allowed for this
- Area organisers need to avoid clashes with Championship events when arranging fixtures
- Most wanted to increase the number of races at two-day Championship events

The Chairman then sought views on publishing the Handbook online as an alternative to the printed Handbook. The members expressed a preference of accessing up to date information on the website rather than having to wait for a printed version.

There being no further discussion, Hugh thanked all those serving as Committee members. He particularly gave thanks to Ivan Washington who steps down after 6 years service as the Cruising Representative. The meeting was closed at 8.50 pm.

Hon. Secretary's Report for AGM 2007 Mounts Bay SC

Mr President, Ladies and Gentlemen

The year 2006 will best be remembered for the World Championship in Ireland, thanks to our hosts Sligo YC who have set a high standard of race management and social functions that will be hard to follow. A very young duo of World Champions has emerged; they are Ian Dobson and Andy Tunnicliffe. The Championship of Ireland 2006 was won by Carl Jeffs and Jim Toothill, but it was Niall Henry and Ossian Geraghty who headed the Irish Gold League. Richard Parker and Dave Hawkins are the National Champions of South Africa. History was made when for the first time a girl helm won the UK Youth Championship; this was Sarah Collingwood with crew Tom Simes.

Fewer UK competitors are travelling to Championships and Opens, so, in response, the UK this year reduced the number of regional Championships to four: the Scottish, Welsh, Northern and Southern, all of which attracted between 20 and 29 entries. Mounts Bay is without doubt the most sought after venue for a UK National Championship, so the number of entries this week is disappointing and decisions will need to be made on the future format of UK Nationals.

Our Fleet Insurance scheme is administered by K Drewe Insurance Ltd who have sponsored a magnificent trophy for the UK Grand Prix series; the names of previous Champions are engraved on the trophy, including Matt Mee and Stuart Bithell for 2006.

In response to falling membership figures, the Committee held a successful Strategic Review Day in November 2006 from which a Strategic Plan emerged. Work began over the winter focusing on several priorities. Updating the Image of the GP14, which involved adopting a modern design of the GP14 logo, was undertaken by Andy Bury. Re-designing and launching a new GP14 website www.gpI4.org was headed by Luke Shaw, who has done much of the development work. The website is receiving a lot of attention and is proving to be a valuable communication tool. A newstyle Mainsail magazine in full colour is the initiative of editor Liz Hall, whilst the future of the GP14 Handbook is currently under review. Dave Rowlands and Oliver Shaw have pooled ideas on adapting the GPI4 as a training boat and are currently producing a pamphlet to encourage clubs to adopt the GP14 for training purposes. Paul Simes has become the Chief Training Co-ordinator and has appointed regional training co-ordinators responsible for arranging training courses at clubs in their own region. Paul was also instrumental in coaching 12 young racers on the Howard Davies Training Week at Plas Menai in October 2006. The membership database has been updated using Access software to run on modern computer hardware. Thanks are recorded to the Office administrators Sue Sinclair and Irene Thompson for their commitment to learn and become familiar with new procedures.

Despite all this activity, I have to report that membership figures continue to decline at the rate of 8%. It may be too early to measure the effect of implementing all the initiatives in the Strategic Plan. There is some good news from Australia, where the GP14 fleet at Dunsborough Bay YC is growing in strength. There are two active clubs in South Africa; George Lakes YC and Pretoria SC. Ceylon Motor YC reports a more competitive GP14 fleet at this club in Sri Lanka.

Paul Simes and his team organized a larger size GP14 stand at the RYA Dinghy Show in March 2006, such that both a Speed Sails FRP boat and a wooden Duffin built hull shared the display. The T&R Committee, chaired by Dave Rowlands, has amended a couple of GP14 rules, allowing foils to be manufactured using materials other than wood, and dispensing with the requirement of having sail numbers on spinnakers.

Ivan Washington has represented a dedicated group of cruisers for the past six years and is now stepping down from Committee. Oliver Shaw is set to continue the good work and regularly publishes cruising events on the website and in Mainsail. There is a new trophy to be awarded annually to the best cruising log.

I've kept the GP 14000 Prize Draw until last so you will retain this promotion uppermost in your mind. In 2008, we will reach the enviable achievement of having produced 14000 GP14s. To celebrate this milestone, Speed Sails, with several co-sponsors, have donated a new FRP Series 2 GP14 to be presented to the winner of the Prize Draw in March 2008. The Association hopes to raise a lot of funds from this venture to enhance GP14 sailing activities.

Finally, as reported in Summer Mainsail, it is my intention to step down from the post of Hon. Secretary in 2008.

Hon. Treasurer's Report to the AGM 2007

I refer you to the Annual Accounts for the year ending 30th September 2006, as printed in the 2007 handbook on pages 41-45. As you can see, the Association managed a virtually break-even outcome, despite falling membership which continues to give cause for concern. The break-even result is a credit to the diligent work of our previous Treasurer, Chris Beddow, in managing to reduce costs in line with falling membership revenue.

During the present year, the Association has budgeted for a break-even situation and we believe that we should be close to this. In order to achieve this, despite falling membership, we have reduced staff costs and bank charges and increased subscriptions rates.

Resources have been expended during the year from our development fund to undertake a strategic review of our activities and to provide a new website and an up-to-date database. For the next financial year, in order to continue our attack on costs, consideration is being given to reducing publication costs by transferring much of the handbook content on to the website. It is proposed also to increase annual subscription rates by £1.

In the longer term, with increased use of IT, consideration will be given to further reducing administrative costs.

The Association retains a strong balance sheet which provides vital resources for its continued development.

I commend these accounts for adoption as a true and accurate record of the Association's financial state
